**Definitions:** "Permittee" means any person or municipality issued a permit by the Department to remove or destroy Canada goose nests and eggs.

"Participant" means anyone authorized by the permittee, in writing, to assist the permittee in removing or destroying Canada goose nests and eggs.

**Participation By Others:** Persons other than the permittee may assist in the removal of Canada goose nests or eggs. The Department may limit the number of persons that can assist. All participants shall be selected by the permittee. All participants shall possess written approval from the landowner or property manager when carrying on removal activities.

**Regulation Compliance:** The permittee and all participants shall comply with all hunting and trapping rules specified under ch. NR 10, Wis. Admin. Code, or ch. 29, Wis. Stats., unless otherwise provided in this section. Permittees and participants who fail to comply shall be subject to the penalty applicable to the appropriate ch. NR 10, Wis. Admin. Code, or ch. 29, Wis. Stats., violation. Permittees who fail to comply with all conditions of this permit may forfeit their continuing eligibility for this permit in following years.

**Permit Materials Possession:** Each permit participant shall have in their possession while performing activities under the authority of a Canada goose nest and egg depredation permit any materials issued to the participant by the Department or permittee.

**Permit Materials Restriction:** Permit materials are not transferable and may not be altered or defaced.

**USFWS Requirements:** Before any management actions can be taken the permittee must register with the USFWS at <https://epermits.fws.gov/eRCGR>. In addition, the permittee must submit an annual report to the USFWS by October 31 of each year summarizing removal activities, including the date, numbers, and location of nests and eggs taken. The annual report can be submitted at: <https://epermits.fws.gov/eRCGR>.

**Nest and Egg Destruction Methodologies:** Canada goose eggs may be oiled using 100% corn oil, addled (egg shaking), or punctured and replaced. In addition, Canada goose nests may be destroyed and removed.

**Nest Material and Egg Disposal:** Permittee and authorized participants may possess, transport, and dispose of resident Canada goose nest and eggs taken under this permit. Permittee and authorized participants may not sell, offer for sale, barter, or ship for the purpose of sale or barter any resident Canada goose nest or eggs taken under this permit.

**Reporting:** The Permittee shall maintain complete records of all Canada goose nests removed under this permit using Form 2300-321 supplied by the Department. This report must be submitted to the Department by October 31 in the same year the permit was issued.

Dear Ms. Gresch,

Enclosed is a Cooperative Service Agreement (CSA) for Wildlife Services to conduct Canada Goose and Mute Swan egg oiling on Lake Nagawicka in 2013. Please review and return to our address on the left of this page with a check for \$1,420 made out to "USDA". If you would like an original agreement with all signatures, sign and return two copies, otherwise only one copy is needed.

Similar to what you have done in past years, please develop a map of properties around the lake to secure permission for Wildlife Services to oil eggs of either species on their property. Generally the first goose oiling occurs during the week of April 15<sup>th</sup> each year with subsequent visits in two week intervals.

I have enclosed a Canada Goose Nest and Egg Destruction permit application that needs to be in place for 2013. Please complete and send back to our office with the other materials. We will need a signed copy after you receive it back from the DNR. We will make arrangements with you to pick up a 2013 map and a copy of the signed permit. Similar to last year, I will register on the Federal website on your behalf.

Also, enclosed is a revised WS Form 37 to add Mute Swans and all the components that we have used in managing their populations so the form does not need to be updated in the future. We are only using nest and egg destruction in 2013 unless directed otherwise.

We look forward to continuing to work with you to address conflicts with Canada Geese and Mute Swans. If you have any questions about the agreement or anything else please give me a call at (920) 324-4514.

**COOPERATIVE SERVICE AGREEMENT**  
**Between**  
**CITY OF DELAFIELD**  
**and the**  
**UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE**  
**ANIMAL AND PLANT HEALTH INSPECTION SERVICE (APHIS)**  
**WILDLIFE SERVICES (WS)**

ARTICLE 1

The purpose of this agreement is to cooperate in a wildlife damage management project, as described in the Work Plan on the next page.

ARTICLE 2

APHIS WS has statutory authority under the Act of March 2, 1931 (46 Stat. 1468; 7 U.S.C.426-426b) as amended, and the Act of December 22, 1987 (101Stat. 1329-331, 7 U.S.C. 426c), to cooperate with States, local jurisdictions, individuals, public and private agencies, organizations, and institutions while conducting a program of wildlife services involving mammal and bird species that are reservoirs for zoonotic diseases, or animal species that are injurious and/or a nuisance to, among other things, agriculture, horticulture, forestry, animal husbandry, wildlife, and human health and safety.

ARTICLE 3

APHIS-WS and the CITY OF DELAFIELD agree:

1. APHIS-WS will provide the requested wildlife damage management services as outlined in the Work Plan.
2. The CITY OF DELAFIELD will provide the U.S. Department of Agriculture the sum of **\$1,420.00** to cover the costs as outlined in the Financial Plan. Payment will be made by check payable to "U.S. Department of Agriculture" by a mutually agreed upon date.
3. The CITY OF DELAFIELD ensures and certifies that it is not currently debarred or suspended and is free of delinquent Federal debt.
4. The monies received by APHIS-WS will be used for wildlife damage management activities and upon termination of the agreement any unexpended funds will be retained by APHIS-WS and used on similar program activities.
5. Nothing in this agreement shall prevent APHIS-WS from entering into separate agreements with any other organization or individual for the purpose of providing wildlife damage management services exclusive of those provided for under this agreement.
6. The CITY OF DELAFIELD certifies that APHIS-WS has advised the CITY OF DELAFIELD that there may be private sector service providers available to provide wildlife management services that the CITY OF DELAFIELD is seeking from APHIS-WS.
7. The performance of wildlife damage management actions by APHIS-WS under this agreement is contingent upon a determination by APHIS-WS that such actions are in compliance with the National Environmental Policy Act, Endangered Species Act, and any other applicable environmental statutes. APHIS-WS will not make a final decision to conduct requested wildlife damage management actions until it has made the determination of such compliance.

ARTICLE 4

Pursuant to Section 22, Title 41, United States Code, no member of or delegate to Congress shall be admitted to any share or part of this Agreement or to any benefit to arise therefrom.

ARTICLE 5

APHIS assumes no liability for any actions or activities conducted under this Cooperative Service Agreement except to the extent that recourse or remedies are provided by Congress under the Federal Tort Claims Act (FTCA), (28 U.S.C. 1346(b), 2401(b), and 2671-2680).

ARTICLE 6

The Agreement shall become effective April 1, 2013 and shall continue in effect until the completion or termination of the project (nesting season) and will expire on July 1, 2013. This Agreement may be amended or terminated at any time by mutual agreement of the parties in writing. Further, in the event the CITY OF DELAFIELD does not provide necessary funds, APHIS-WS is relieved of the obligation to provide services under this agreement.

## WORK PLAN

Wildlife Species: Canada Goose (*Branta Canadensis*) and Mute Swan (*Cygnus olor*)

Description of Damage: Canada Goose and Mute Swan nesting poses unacceptable negative impacts to human safety at the project site, due to aggressive geese and swans causing injury or the potential for injury to people associated with the site. Additionally, presence of goose nesting also contributes to over population of geese and unacceptable accumulations of feces and property damage through grazing, trampling, and feces accumulations. Mute Swans are non-native species in Wisconsin and compete for resources (i.e., food, nesting sites, habitat) with native waterfowl.

Location: Lands within the CITY OF DELAFIELD, primarily Lake Nagawicka, Waukesha County, Wisconsin

Services Provided: APHIS-WS was requested by CITY OF DELAFIELD to conduct a Canada Goose and Mute Swan nest/egg oiling project to reduce the number of Canada Geese and Mute Swans using properties on Lake Nagawicka and stop recruitment to the population. APHIS-WS will oil and/or remove goose and swan nest(s) including nesting material and eggs contained within the nest(s) under authority of a State of Wisconsin Canada Goose nest/egg depredation permit issued to the CITY OF DELAFIELD. Permits are not needed for removal of Mute Swan nests and eggs, however, authority will be granted to APHIS-WS by the Wisconsin DNR. APHIS-WS will dispose of eggs and nesting material in accordance with Federal and state requirements. APHIS-WS will comply with all necessary recordkeeping requirements, including compliance with the National Environmental Policy Act.

The Cooperator and APHIS-WS Agree:

- All activities will be conducted in accordance with Federal, and applicable State and local laws, regulations, permits, and other authorities.
- The CITY OF DELAFIELD will respond to all media, public, and residential requests for information.
- The CITY OF DELAFIELD will grant APHIS-WS the use of boat launch facility at no charge.
- The CITY OF DELAFIELD will provide APHIS-WS with a detailed map of property ownership adjacent to Lake Nagawicka.
- The CITY OF DELAFIELD will acquire written permission from Lake Nagawicka residents interested in allowing APHIS-WS access to their property to manage Canada Goose and Mute Swan nests and will notify APHIS-WS of properties that permission was not granted.
- APHIS-WS, on behalf of the CITY OF DELAFIELD, will register on the USFWS web site for all Canada Goose nest/egg activities as required under the State of Wisconsin Canada Goose nest/egg depredation permit and will provide a letter to APHIS-WS allowing for permitted activities.
- APHIS-WS will only conduct Canada Goose and Mute Swan nest management activities on properties where landowner consent has been acquired and will be notified of properties that permission was not granted.
- Canada Goose nests will be disposed of humanely, according to permit authorities. Geese, nests, and/or eggs will not be relocated elsewhere.
- APHIS-WS will assist the CITY OF DELAFIELD with obtaining a State of Wisconsin Canada Goose nest/egg depredation permit and provide information to report for the 2013 annual report, as required.
- The CITY OF DELAFIELD will be responsible for establishing an integrated wildlife damage management plan at their discretion to prevent future negative impacts by Canada Geese after APHIS-WS has conducted their initial egg and nest removal, unless the cooperator requests an additional Cooperative Service Agreement from APHIS-WS to implement such a plan or conduct further actions.

I, the cooperator or cooperator's representative, have been informed of the methods and the manner in which the control materials and devices listed in Section 4 will be used, and of the possible hazards associated with their use. I understand that APHIS, (to include its officers, employees and agents) will: exercise reasonable precautions to safeguard all persons to prevent injury to animal life other than those listed in Section 3, Item 14. (and Item 15., if applicable); guard against the mishandling of control devices and materials; and exercise due caution and proper judgment in all wildlife damage management operations. I understand that APHIS, WS, will maintain restricted use pesticide application records on applications made under the Work Initiation Document, and that APHIS, WS, will provide copies of the records or record information promptly upon the property owner's or cooperator's request. I understand that APHIS may collect Global Positioning System (GPS) coordinates at the project site as part of component or activity tracking or as wildlife disease monitoring or research data.

SECTION 6

18. In consideration of these understandings and of the benefits to be derived, I, the cooperator or cooperator's representative, agree to: take reasonable precautions to prevent injury to livestock and other domestic animals; assume responsibility for injury to my property under my control, when said injury is not the result of negligence on the part of APHIS; assist in maintaining such warning signs as APHIS may place for the purpose of notifying persons entering onto such lands of the possible hazards associated with wildlife damage management measures in use thereon; and to give adequate warning of these possible hazards to persons I authorize to enter onto such lands. Further, in recognition of the benefits to be derived from the use of specified methods and devices authorized by this Work Initiation Document, I, the cooperator or cooperator's representative, agree not to concurrently use or allow to be used upon lands covered by this Work Initiation Document, any toxic material that might reasonably be expected to take a species listed above in Section 3, Item 14. (and Item 15., if applicable) unless such use of said toxicant is agreed to by APHIS in writing.

SPECIAL CONSIDERATIONS:



Dear Goose Round-up Permittee,

Enclosed is a copy of the WS Form 37 and other materials submitted on your behalf to the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) for your Federal depredation permit. This permit will allow you to have USDA, Wildlife Services (WS) round-up and remove Canada Geese. The USFWS will review your renewal materials and determine if a depredation permit should be issued. Please be aware it may take several weeks for you to receive the permit in the mail.

**To conduct an effective and cost efficient round-up at your location you need to ensure the stipulations below are implemented and/or provided.**

- 1) Continue non-lethal abatement measures (habitat management, fencing, harassment, aggressive egg oiling program, etc.)
- 2) Provide public notification of a potential round-up, as appropriate.
- 3) Periodically scout the location and number of birds at your site.
- 4) Secure access to properties where geese frequent. **WS needs written permission to enter private property to capture geese.** Winter and early spring may be a good time to secure access on properties where we may have captured birds in the past. Proactively securing permission will increase efficiency and keep round-up costs to a minimum.
- 5) Budget \$5,000 for all cost aspects of the round-up with final actual costs frequently less than this amount. ~~Contaminant testing may be required at your location in 2013.~~ - No testing required in 2013 or 2014
- 6) Provide 1 - 4 people on day of the round-up to facilitate WS access to the birds at your site.
- 7) Lake Districts need to provide a person scouting the number and location of birds via boat on the day of the round-up prior to WS arrival and a person to help guide vehicles around the lake to the located birds.
- 8) If assistance is not provided, the round-up may not occur and you may be charged for WS time.
- 9) If there are not a sufficient number of birds at your site a round-up will not be conducted so pre-scouting the birds is essential.

As we approach the round-up timeframe, WS will be in contact and send out a Cooperative Service Agreement that reiterates the above listed items for the round-up. If you have any questions or concerns please contact me at 920-324-4514.

Geese may be held overnight under humane conditions for transport to a poultry processing facility where they may be euthanized and processed for human or animal consumption.

Euthanized Canada Geese suitable for processing for human consumption will be distributed free to charitable organizations whenever possible and practical. Geese not used for human consumption may be distributed to captive animal facilities for animal dietary purposes only. Birds not donated must be disposed of by burial or incineration.

USDA Wildlife Services employees should be authorized to conduct the depredation activity. Subpermittees should include employees of Loehrs Meat Service, Quality Cut Meats, and Door County Custom Meats and other designees of the permit holder.
